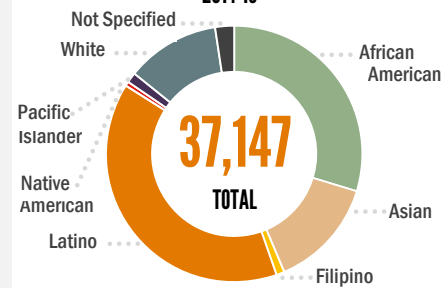

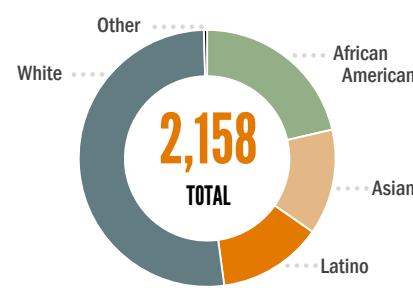
#### STUDENTS 2014-15<sup>1</sup>

#### TEACHERS 2014-15<sup>2</sup>



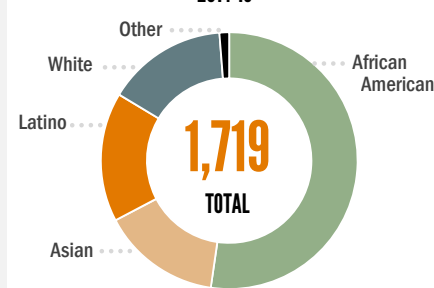

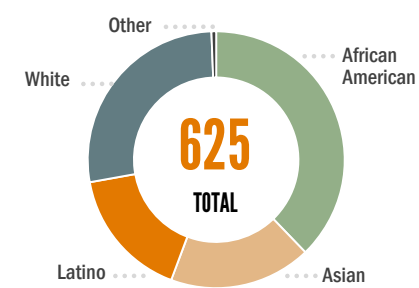

These pathways prepare high school students for career and a full range of postsecondary options. 6) Chronic Absence is defined as being absent 10% or more of school days for any reason. 7) Special Education enrollment includes students with disabilities enrolled in OUSD TK-12 schools, Home and Hospital program and Young Adult Program. 8) Students who receive free/reduced-price breakfast/lunch can also receive after school snacks, if eligible.
